DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

SAT 27 JAN **Depart U.S.**

Depart Seattle and connect with the overnight flight to Tel Aviv. (Meals in-flight)

SUN 28 JAN **Arrive Tel Aviv/Netanya**

Upon late afternoon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, your guide and driver will be waiting to greet you. Transfer to your hotel for check-in, dinner and overnight. Seasons Hotel (Meals in-flight, D)

MON 29 JAN **Netanya/Galilee**

Drive along the Mediterranean coast to Caesarea, once the Roman capital of Palestine. See the Crusader fortifications, the Roman amphitheater, aqueduct, and the harbor from where the Apostle Paul was taken to Rome. Then drive up Mt. Carmel and enjoy a panoramic view of the Jezreel Valley. Continue to Nazareth and visit the Church of the Annunciation, the Greek Orthodox Church, and Mary's Well. Tour Nazareth Village, a living history museum, which recreates life in the first century. Stop for a view of the Sea of Galilee from the Cliffs of Arbel before proceeding to the hotel by Lake Kinneret, the Sea of Galilee. Kibbutz Ein Gev (B, D)

TUE 30 JAN **Galilee**

This morning stop to see the Jesus Boat – a First Century boat discovered in the mud of the Galilee. Then embark on a boat ride across the peaceful Galilee waters. Return to the shore and visit the Ancient Synagogue and St. Peter's House at Capernaum; this is where Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law and others. Drive along the north shore to the Church of the Beatitudes, one of the most beautiful in the Galilee. Continue northward to Mt. Hermon and the Golan Heights before returning along the east side of the Galilee to your lodging. Kibbutz Ein Gev (B, D)

WED 31 JAN **Galilee/Bethlehem**

Drive to Bet She'an, where excavations have revealed ruins of major archaeological significance; the history of the site goes back to the 4th millennium B.C. Continue through the Jordan Valley to Jericho to ascend the Mt. of Temptation, then through the Judean Desert to arrive in Bethlehem. Check in at the Christian guesthouse that is affiliated with the International Center of Bethlehem (ICB), a member of the Diyar Consortium. Stroll into the Old City of Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity and Manger Square. This evening meet a local mufti at ICB to learn about Islamic faith practices. Lutheran Guesthouse Bethlehem (B, D)

THU 01 FEB **Bethlehem**

This morning learn about the varied ministries of the Diyar Consortium and tour the International Center of Bethlehem (ICB), Christmas Lutheran Church, Diyar University College and Diyar Health and Wellness Center. Also meet with the Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb, director of the Diyar Consortium and pastor of Evangelical Christmas Lutheran Church, to learn about their work and about the Palestinian Christians of Bethlehem. This afternoon make two uniquely contrasting visits: one at Deheishe Palestinian refugee camp and the other at Efrat Israeli settlement. Lutheran Guesthouse Bethlehem (B, D)

FRI 02 FEB **Bethlehem**

Proceed to the top of the Mount of Olives for a glorious view of Jerusalem. Here on the same hilltop is Augusta Victoria Hospital. The group will meet with the Rev. Mark Brown to learn of the

I am really excited about the opportunities and conversations that we will have on this trip to Israel/Palestine, and then on to Jordan for those who wish to continue. We will have the opportunity to learn from not only the sites and places mentioned in scripture, but also from the people who currently live in the Holy Land.

Not many groups have the chance to stay in Bethlehem, so we have a rare opportunity to be not only in the city of Jesus' birth, but to stay with and learn from the people of Christmas Lutheran Church and the Diyar Consortium, which is a ministry arm of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land.

My hope is that we will return with a deeper understanding of the land of the roots of our faith as well as an honest respect for all of the people of the Book.

healing work of the Lutheran World Federation before walking down the Palm Sunday Road. Visit Yad Vashem, a moving memorial to the Holocaust. On the return to the West Bank stop at Shepherds' Fields in Beit Sahour. This is the best place to view Bethlehem as it would have been seen by nearby shepherds during the time of the birth of Jesus. Enjoy a dinner of Palestinian cuisine and ambience at The Grotto Restaurant. Lutheran Guesthouse Bethlehem (B, D)

SAT 03 FEB **Bethlehem/Jerusalem**

Travel to the lowest point on earth, the Dead Sea. Take a cable car up to Masada, Herod's royal citadel overlooking the sea. On this rocky plateau, the Zealots held their last resistance against the Roman conquerors, around 70 A.D. Stop at Ein Bokek for an optional float in the briny waters of the Dead Sea, then visit Qumran, the site of the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Continue to Jerusalem for hotel check-in, dinner and overnight in the Old City. St. Mark's Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

SUN 04 FEB **Jerusalem**

This morning attend worship at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer followed by a meeting with the English-language pastor to learn about the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL). After lunch see the ancient Western Wall, considered to be one of the holiest sites in the Jewish tradition. Ascend to the Temple Mount/Haram al Sharif and view the golden Dome of the Rock, an important symbol of the Muslim faith (no inside visits to the mosques are permitted at this time). This evening hear from a representative of Rabbis For Human Rights. St. Mark's Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

MON 05 FEB **Jerusalem**

Spend the morning on a memorable guided tour of the Old City including a walk along the Via Dolorosa through the Old City to experience the Stations of the Cross; see the last few Stations located inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. The afternoon will be free for individual exploration. Gather for a farewell dinner at an Armenian restaurant in the Old City. St. Mark's Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

TUE 06 FEB **Return to U.S.**

Transfer to the airport for flight check-in and departure to the U.S. Arrive home today enriched with your discoveries of faith and friendship in the Holy Land. (B, Meals in-flight)

OPTIONAL JORDAN EXTENSION

TUE 06 FEB **Jerusalem/Petra**

This morning transfer to the Allenby Crossing to Jordan and meet your Jordanian guide, driver and coach. Visit Bethany-beyond-the-Jordan, which has received recognition as the likely site where John baptized Jesus. Continue through the vast desert to the village of Wadi Musa, which embraces the entrance to Petra – one of the Seven Modern Wonders of the World. Petra Guesthouse (B, D)

WED 07 FEB **Petra**

Two thousand years ago the Nabateans carved a city out of rose red rock and it was rediscovered in 1812. Today you will discover the formerly lost city of Petra during a guided tour. Begin by walking through the dramatic "ciq" or canyon that opens upon the Treasury, El Khazneh, one of the most elegant remains of antiquity. Beyond El Khazneh the visitor is surrounded on both sides by hundreds of Petra's carved and built structures. Enjoy a full day of touring this amazing, once-hidden world. Petra Guesthouse (B, D)

THU 08 FEB **Petra/Tel Aviv**

Depart on the northbound journey to the village of Madeba to see the ancient mosaic map of the Holy Land. Drive to Mount Nebo where Moses viewed the Promised Land and enjoy the dramatic view of the Jordan Valley, Jericho and the Judean hills beyond. Cross the Allenby Bridge to meet your guide and driver for the transfer to your Tel Aviv area hotel. (B, D)

FRI 09 FEB **Return to U.S.**

Transfer to the airport for flight check-in and departure to the U.S. Arrive home today enriched with your discoveries of faith and friendship in the Holy Land. (B, Meals in-flight)
