


The Church at Corinth

Paul helped churches grow all over the world. One church was in a place called Corinth (KOHR-inth). Paul taught lots of people about Jesus and helped them understand Jesus' love. Some of his friends were Priscilla, Aquila, Titus Justus, and Crispus. They loved Jesus and worked to make the church strong.

It was hard to be a Christian in the beginning. Lots of people wanted to hurt Christians. They were afraid of Jesus' love and power.

It was hard to start a new church, too. Sometimes people didn't get along. They didn't agree about little details. They didn't always remember what Paul taught them. Paul wrote letters to help the people. He reminded them of what was important: Jesus' love.


PERSECUTION
