Ash Wednesday: a synopsis

Ash Wednesday is the most somber day of the church year with a mood of penitence and reflection on our faith and life. Although penitence is to be taken seriously and practiced with care, this is not supposed to be an occasion to wallow in our sins. The word "Lent" means "springtime" which is a time of preparation, planting, and growth. Therefore, during the season of Lent, the focus of our penitence is for the preparation and growth of faith - a "holy springtime of the soul."

In this special service marking the beginning of the season, we use ashes as a symbol to remind us of our frailty. Ashes represent judgment, humility, repentance, mortality, God's condemnation of sin, and our complete dependence on God for faith and life. Ashes also represent cleansing and rebirth. Ashes are what remain when the old has been burned away and the new life is left to sprout and grow. So, we use ashes as a reminder of our sin and as a sign of the hope of the new life we share in Christ Jesus.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES




LORD'S PRAYER
